UTILITY INFORMATION

PUBLIC RECORDS REQUEST

Names and addresses of Milan Utility customers are public record. If a public records request is made, social security numbers will be redacted. If you have a civil protection order, please provide the utility office with a copy of the protection order to be excluded.

CHECK PAYMENT POLICY

The utility office will not accept post dated checks. All checks are deposited on the day they are received.

ELECTRIC DEPT. NEWS

When flying kites, trimming trees and using ladders around power lines be aware of the electrical hazards.



WATER DEPT. NEWS

The Village of Milan Water Dept. will be flowing fire hydrants on Tuesday and Thursday mornings between the hours of 9:00 am and 12:00 noon throughout the summer months, beginning in May. Residents in affected areas may notice a slight discoloration in the water and are advised to let the water run until it clears.

STREET DEPARTMENT

BRUSH PICKUP

The Village will resume brush pick up, e.g. **tree trimmings only**, on Monday, April 6TH. Brush pickup will continue on the first Monday of each month with the exception of Labor Day in September (which will be performed on Monday, Sept. 14th). The last brush pickup will be held on Monday, October 5TH. **Please remember no yard waste or garden refuse, shrubs, roots, or complete tree removal will be picked up. Please do not place items for pickup on the tree lawn in front of your home until the day before the scheduled pickup.**



SPRING AND FALL YARD WASTE PICKUP

The Village Spring and Fall Yard Waste Pickup for this year will be on the following Mondays; May 11th, June 15th and October 19th. Residents who have material for collection should place their material curbside according to the following.

1. All material for collection must be yard waste only (grass, weeds & shrubs) free from trash and plastic. Absolutely no plastic or stones.
2. Maximum container weight 50 lbs.
3. Material will be collected in:

Compost-able Kraft paper bags, cardboard boxes or 30 gallon trash container clearly marked "yard waste". Bulk bushes should be tied with jute twine, no wire or nylon.

The Kraft paper bags can be purchased at Lowe's, Barnes Nursery and Ace Hardware in Huron.

DETACHMENT

With the cooperation of the adjacent property owners, the Village successfully detached (Ohio Revised Code speak for de-annexed) the Huron County portion of the right of way of US 250. As the entire bridge and most of the approach is no longer in the Village, ODOT will have to fund any and all repairs going forward. This action by the Mayor and Council will save the Village nearly \$100,000 for just this one repair ODOT attempted to place on the Village.



SWIMMING POOL AND HOT TUB INSPECTIONS

Residents need to be aware all swimming pools and hot tubs 24” in depth or more must receive an electrical inspection. Any pool or hot tub with a filtering system regardless of depth must also have an electrical inspection. The inspection is required for the initial installation only as long as the pool or tub installation does not change.

PLACEMENT OF SIGNS ON UTILITY POLES PROHIBITED

The placement of any type of privately owned signs including garage sales on municipally owned utility poles within the Village is prohibited.

PEDDLER’S & SOLICITORS

If you have a peddler or a solicitor you should ask them if they have a license to do so. If they do not produce a license, please call the police department and let Chief Ward know. According to Milan’s ordinance no person, firm or corporation shall engage in the business or activity of peddler or solicitor in this Municipality without first obtaining a license. Each and every person peddling or soliciting shall pay the fees set forth in Section 741.04.



SAFETY

School will be out shortly for the summer and with nice weather approaching, children come out to play. Please drive slower and safely because they sometimes don’t think before going out in the roadway.

--Just a reminder that all bicycles are subject to the same rules as a vehicle while riding in the roadway.

--Skateboards, rollerblade and roller skates are prohibited in the streets.



WALKERS - Just a reminder that walkers need to walk facing traffic while walking in the roadway.

NATIONAL ARBOR DAY FOUNDATION



Milan has again been named a Tree City USA community by The National Arbor Day Foundation to honor its commitment to community forestry. It is the sixth consecutive year Milan has received this national recognition. Milan has met or exceeded the four standards to become a Tree City USA community: a tree board or department, a tree care ordinance, a comprehensive community forestry program, and an Arbor Day observance.

ERIE COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT CLINICS

The Erie County Health Department is offering public health nursing outreach services at the Milan Village Administration Building from **8:00 a.m. - 10:00 a.m.** on the following dates: **April 22, May 13, June 3, June 24, July 15, August 5, August 26, and September 16.**

Some of the services that they will provide include: Child, adolescent, and adult vaccines, blood pressure screening, individual health assessments which include lipid profile, blood glucose, hemoglobin A1Cm, health risk assessment (please note fasting 9-12 hours before testing is required for individual health assessments.), provide referral source services, community outreach and healthy lifestyle education.

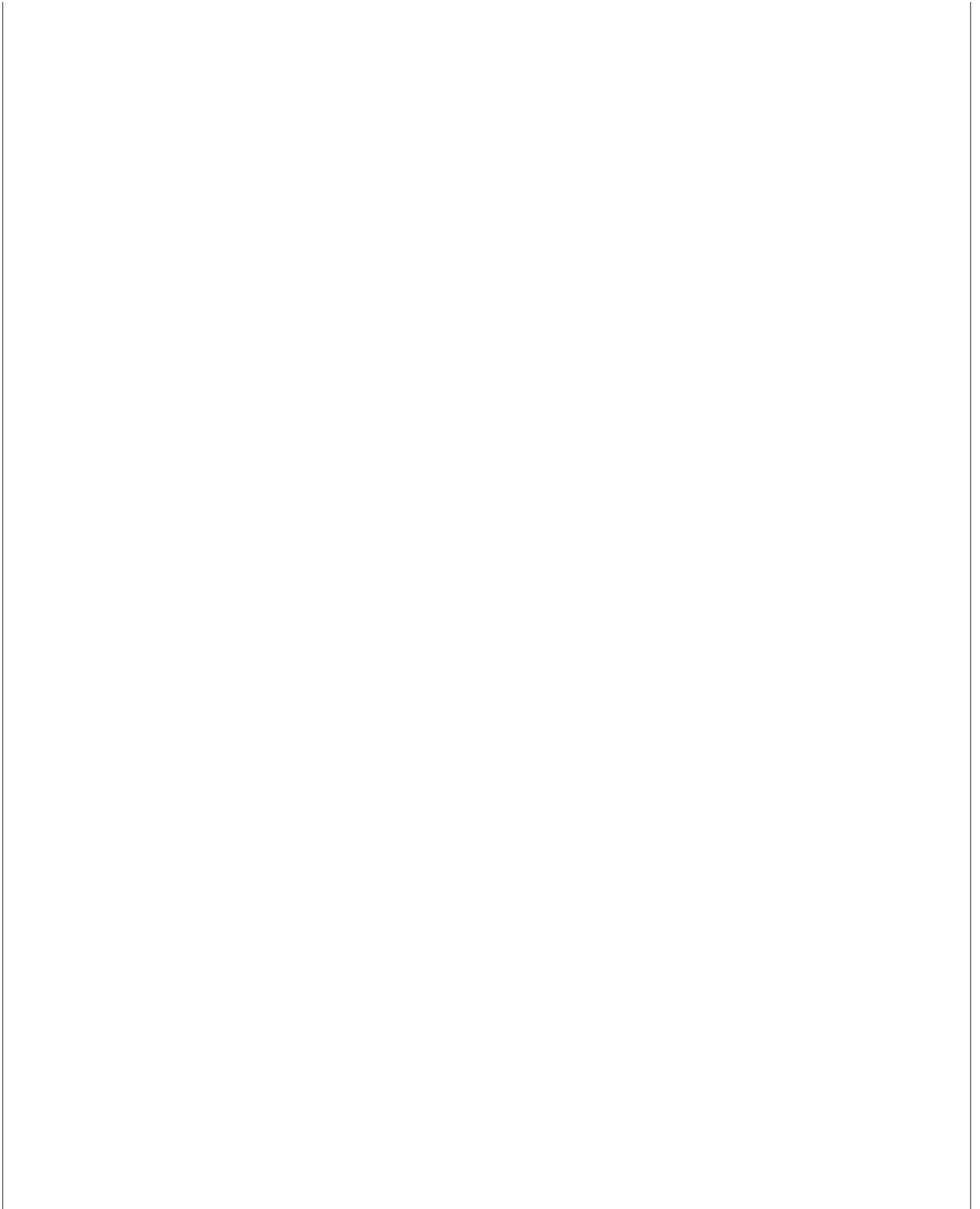
